## Policy Coverage available under Education Insurance

There are 14 optional policy sections under our Education policy, for events happening during the period of insurance.

<b>Section 1</b> <b>Property Insurance</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>— catastrophe escalation costs for increases in rebuilding costs following a catastrophe</li><li>— cover for curios, pictures, works of art and antiques, jewellery, articles of gold or silver;</li><li>— cover for alterations and additions to buildings up to \$500,000;</li><li>— additional covers through a number of extensions for:<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• personal effects of directors and employees;</li><li>• fire extinguishment costs, removal of debris, architects and other professionals' fees;</li><li>• removal of debris up to 15% of the total declared values or \$500,000 which ever is the lesser;</li><li>• costs following sudden blockages of drains and locating leaks;</li><li>• contents temporarily removed to 20% of declared value;</li><li>• furniture and equipment in transit from specified perils;</li><li>• fusion of electric motors and deterioration of refrigerated goods;</li><li>• damage to property at exhibition, festivals and events anywhere in Australia;</li><li>• damage to raffle prizes, donated goods, exhibited goods, bequeathed property anywhere in Australia;</li><li>• Cost of rewriting records including electronic data.</li></ul></li></ul>
<b>Section 2</b> <b>Interruption Insurance</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>— loss of income during the indemnity period as a result of damage occurring during the period of insurance and a claim being admitted under section 1, Part A or B of section 3 or section 13;</li><li>— additional cover through extensions for:<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• loss of income following damage to property in the vicinity, service suppliers' property and suppliers' premises;</li><li>• loss of income exceeding 48 hours following prevention of access to insured premises by order of authorities;</li></ul></li><li>— additional increase in costs of working following insured damage;</li><li>— accountants and other professional fees to prepare claims;</li><li>— irrecoverable outstanding debts following insured damage.</li></ul>
<b>Section 3</b> <b>Crime Cover</b>	<p>Options under this section include the following which occurs during the period of insurance:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>— Part A – loss of money in transit or on premises including money in the custody or premises of officials and includes;<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• 100% increased limits for fundraising events;</li><li>• replacement of locks following theft of keys.</li></ul></li><li>— Part B – burglary or theft of property (other than money) from the location and includes;<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• theft of curios, pictures, works of art, gold or silver articles, to \$2,500 per item and property belonging to directors and employees;</li><li>• personal effects cover for your officials, employees, students and volunteers;</li><li>• theft of property in the open air, property temporarily removed;</li><li>• replacement of locks following theft of keys and temporary protection.</li></ul></li><li>— Part C – theft of money or property by officials discovered within 12 months and includes;<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• claim preparation costs to 10% of claim or \$20,000 which ever is the lesser amount;</li><li>• losses by unidentified officials.</li></ul></li></ul>

<b>Section 4</b> <b>Glass breakage</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>— accidental breakage of external and internal glass including glass in skylights, fixed mirrors, furniture and shelving at the location and includes: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• replacement of glass in accordance with recent regulations, repair to window or door frames, temporary shuttering and sign writing;</li> <li>• replacement of broken glass in lead lights and ornamental glass windows;</li> <li>• replacement of contaminated contents.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
<b>Section 5</b> <b>Breakdown of mechanical and electronic equipment</b>	<p>Options under this section include the following which occurs during the period of insurance:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>— Part A – breakdown in use of declared mechanical equipment and explosion of boilers and pressure vessels and including: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• impact to surrounding property by flying fragments;</li> <li>• new for old cover for equipment less than 3 years old;</li> <li>• additional expenditure for temporary repairs, hire of alternative equipment, overtime expenses, express freight, removing debris;</li> <li>• deterioration of refrigerated goods following insured damage (optional).</li> </ul> </li> <li>— Part B – breakdown in use of electronic equipment and includes: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• dismantling and re-erection costs;</li> <li>• new for old cover for equipment less than 3 years old;</li> <li>• additional expenditure for removing debris, temporary repairs, expediting costs, express freight and custom dues;</li> <li>• damage to data media material and restoration of records (optional);</li> <li>• increase in costs of working following insured damage where the repairs exceed 48 hours (optional).</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
<b>Section 6</b> <b>Liability Insurance</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>— legal liability to pay compensation for property damage, personal injury or advertising injury caused by an occurrence happening in connection with your occupation during the period of insurance;</li> <li>— property owners liability;</li> <li>— legal liability from products but not second-hand electrical goods unless appropriately tested;</li> <li>— liability from hazardous activities noted in the certificate of insurance;</li> <li>— liability from molestation and sexual abuse, except from known offenders and provided adequate procedures, written guidelines and protocols are in place.</li> </ul> <p>This section also provides extensions to cover:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>— property in care custody and control</li> </ul>
<b>Section 7</b> <b>Professional Indemnity</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>— legal liability to pay compensation and expenses arising from claims made against you or any of your employees resulting from breach of duty in connection with your organisation.</li> </ul>
<b>Section 8</b> <b>Liability of Officials</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>— compensate the directors and/or officers for loss arising from a claim or for any wrongful act committed by them in their capacity as directors or officers of the company.</li> </ul>
<b>Section 9</b> <b>Employment Practices</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>— legal liability to pay compensation arising from any claim by a current or former employee or a contract worker alleging a wrongful act.</li> </ul>
<b>Section 10</b> <b>Personal Accident for Teachers and other employees</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>— lump sum and permanent disablement benefits following accidental bodily injury suffered by care providers;</li> <li>— weekly benefits following accidental bodily injury or illness suffered whilst at work;</li> <li>— out of pocket expenses (excluding hospital and Medicare costs) and domestic help expenses covered for care providers where necessitated.</li> </ul>

<b>Section 11</b> <b>Personal Accident for Student's</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>— lump sum and permanent disablement benefits following accidental bodily injury suffered by a student;</li> <li>— out of pocket expenses (excluding hospital and Medicare costs) cover where necessitated;</li> <li>— weekly care benefits for parents (if time must be taken from work) or guardians (where parents are unable to take time off work) when a qualified medical practitioner necessitates the child must be cared for at home;</li> </ul>
<b>Section 12</b> <b>Personal Accident for Volunteers</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>— lump sum and permanent disablement benefits following accidental bodily injury suffered by volunteers:</li> <li>• temporary disablement benefits provided for volunteers in receipt of an income;</li> <li>• out of pocket expenses (excluding hospital and Medicare costs) and domestic help expenses covered for volunteers where necessitated.</li> </ul>
<b>Section 13</b> <b>General Property</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>— a choice of accidental damage or defined events covers anywhere within the geographic limits to the property you specifically nominate.</li> </ul>
<b>Section 14</b> <b>Tax Audit Expenses</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>— expenses incurred by your organisation for professional fees incurred as a result of a tax audit conducted by the Australian Taxation Office.</li> </ul>

General exclusions:

- war, confiscation by authorities, nuclear risks
- terrorism
- computer crime, computer virus
- loss as a result of quarantinable diseases under the Quarantine Act (1908)
- unexplained disappearance
- contract works exceeding \$500,000
- normal wear and tear, settlement, shrinkage or expansion
- loss of electronic data except where specifically insured
- consequential loss except where specifically provided

Contract works can be insured more appropriately and separately under other policies of insurance.
